What is SIYANDIZA?

The SA Air Force has created the Siyandiza Programme to promote awareness and development amongst, primarily the disadvantaged youth of South Africa, by offering awareness and development programme and informing them of career options available to them in the SA Air Force. The emphasis is placed on careers such as pilot, navigator, air traffic control, mission control and engineering.

What is a Young Falcon?

The Young Falcon Programme is the development phase of the Siyandiza programme of aviation awareness. The learners applying for the Young Falcon programme must be in Grade 10 or 11 to commence with the development training.

Who can apply for the Young Falcon programme?

You need to have mathematics, science and English to be considered for the training programme.

Where will the Young Falcons programme be offered?

The programme commences with a preliminary course at the Air Force Base/Unit nearest to the learners home. This course could be presented in one of two ways, namely, a ten-day continuous course at the Base/Unit during the school holidays, or by attending the course every second Saturday until the course is completed. The method employed by the Base/Unit would depend on circumstances such as availability of accommodation at the Base/Unit.

During this first year of the training various visits and other activities are organised for the Young Falcons. The Young Falcon will be continuously monitored throughout the year to determine suitability for the desired functional employment of the learner.

In the second year as a Young Falcon you may be selected to attend the advanced course, which will be presented over a ten-day period during school holidays at the different Bases/Units.

What do the Young Falcons learn?

The Young Falcons will be exposed to many aspects of aviation through visits and lectures to enable them to appreciate the world of aviation and what it entails. To name but a few, virtual aviation, navigation, meteorology, radiotelephony, aerodynamics, propulsion systems, instrumentation, how radio and radar work as well as some life skills.

What happens after completion of the training programme?

The grade 12 learners interested in a career in the SA Air Force are given a preparation phase to prepare them for the selection process of the SA Air Force.
